Bahauddin Science College, Junagadh was established in 1901, to have the privilege to be affiliated with four universities: Bombay University, Gujarat University, Saurashtra University and at present Bhakta Kavi Narsinh Mehta University. This is because of careful and effective implementation of the curriculum through the well-planned and effective process. The synchronization of effective curriculum delivery process with prevailing academic environment of heritage institute has been developed and deployed to obtain optimum results.

The IQAC of the college with all Heads of Departments (HoDs) and staff members develops strategies for effective implementation of the curriculum. HoDs allocates the theory and laboratory courses to faculties according to area of expertise, skills and relevant experience. Teachers are encouraged to impart the curriculum through presentations, assignments, discussions, workshops, seminars and industrial visits, field visits, study tour including the regular/traditional chalk and talk methods. The requirement of books, journals, e-journals, etc. is regularly fulfilled. Monitoring of the same is done regularly by Principal and HoDs of respective departments. Since the COVID pandemic, Education department, Government of Gujarat has also been providing a central common academic calendar, implemented by all the universities and in accordance with that college also prepares its own academic calendar.

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The advanced and slow learners are identified during classroom and practical teaching and are encouraged to be in touch with concerned teachers to enhance their learning. Here, we would like to emphasize that as there is ample chance to interact one to one with the students especially in practical, the learning levels of the students can be evaluated and queries and doubts can be quenched very easily.

Distinction of the students over their performance is easily sought and hence categorization as advanced and slow learners is done. Advanced and slow learners are identified through their performance levels in regular classroom test, presentation, viva and interaction in class room and laboratory.

Special classes for slow learners are conducted to teach them in feasible manner with all necessary tools, such as models, pictures, animated videos etc. Upon series of interactions, required suggestions are given at the first stage with all necessary instructions to increase his/her strength to become good learner of both theoretical as well as practical aspects. As per the provision in CBCS guidelines, a slow learner is offered periodic tests to increase confidence level to learn subject and to perform well.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

We follow all the student centric methods like participatory learning through group discussion, seminars, quizzes, puzzles, demonstrations, assignments and field visits to involve the students actively into their own learning process. Active participation in terms of sample collection, chemical preparation, circuit preparation for different devices, models and chart preparations provide an opportunity to nurture students interest in the subject.

Field expeditions are conducted in Botany and Zoology departments. The Girnar Sanctuary and Gir National Park, the last abode of Asiatic Lion, and the Sakkar-Baug Zoological Park in vicinity provides a good exposure to rich flora and fauna of the forest is the privilege to the students to develop their taxonomic and wildlife research skills by visiting the Protected Areas.

Gujarat, being one of the most developed industrial states of country; Chemistry department make visits to industries like pharmaceuticals, dyes, fertilizers to give students hands-on training and thus, enhances their career opportunities.

Physics department visits every year Indian Plasma Research (IPR), Physical Research Laboratory (PRL), Space Application Centre (SAC) ISRO, Ahmedabad.

The college has signed MoU with Regional Forensic Science Laboratory (RFSL) branch of DFS. Every year, students are benefited with the well-equipped sophisticated instrumentation under the guidance of forensic scientists.

The faculties are encouraged to train themselves in ICT in addition to the traditional chalk and talk method. For a better understanding of the subject, teachers practice various ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process.

Five connection with BHARAT fiber optics, NAMO Wi-Fi scheme provided internet facility on the campus. The whole campus has been equipped with Wi-Fi using the 24 routers.

Multimedia presentations are used as part of regular classroom teaching. We have privilege to have LCD projectors in almost all the classrooms and there are smart classrooms as well for better multimedia exposure. Teacher can use the videos captured with SONY handy-cam and display in classroom. Bhaskaracharya Institute for Space Applications and Geo-Informatics (BISAG), an initiative of the Government of Gujarat where state wide classroom known as SANDHAN with the help of satellite disc tv. SANDHAN is a part of college time table. In recent times, colleges also benefited by MS team, initiative of Government of Gujarat to carry out all the academic programs like teaching, examination, assignment submission during the pandemic period. College also use social media platforms like whatsapp, etc. to sort-out the queries and problems of the students.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The evaluation mechanism followed by the College is in conformity with the affiliating university, i.e. Bhakta Kavi Narsinh Mehta University, Junagadh (BKNMU). University has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in across all of its curricula. Continuous Internal Evaluation system is an integral part of the evaluation mechanism in CBCS. The college has an internal examination committee which looks after the conduction of internal examination as scheduled by university and prepare results. The time table for internal examinations is prepared, displayed on the central notice board and also sent to respective departments.

Teachers assess a student in a course through their interaction throughout the semester for their internal evaluation including one or more of the following mechanisms such as written tests, class presentations/seminars, viva, assignments, quizzes, etc. with their maximum weightage of 30 marks. Internal examination is conducted under CCTV surveillance with utmost confidentiality. We have 5 marks for regular attendance in internal evaluation. The marks of internal evaluation are put on the notice board and then entry of the same is made online onto the university portal. The remaining 70% of the marks are awarded through the External Semester Examination conducted by the university.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The grievances of the students related to examinations are addressed at two levels—College and University—depending upon the nature of

the grievances. Grievances related to the internal assessment are handled by the internal examination committee of the College whereas grievances related to the external assessment are forwarded to the University. Here, we would like to mention that we are fortunate so far we have not received any complaint regarding internal assessment due to transparent mechanism.

All the examinations are conducted under active CCTV surveillance with recording facility. Students are free to approach teachers and heads of departments to resolve their queries related to the marks obtained in internal assessment. If the student concerned is not satisfied by the procedure mentioned above, they may approach to the internal examination committee of the college or the Principal. Thus, grievance redressal with reference to examinations is transparent. Examination related grievances are received by the authorities concerned of the college in a time-bound manner. All complaints are attended with utmost alacrity and resolved. The grievance redressal mechanism pertaining to examinations is efficient as all complaints to be entertained without exception and to be resolved within a reasonable amount of time.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

This college spreads over 6070 m² of campus with built-up area of 4509 m². The college has 15 classrooms (7 smart-class) equipped with audio-visual aids, 15 laboratories, library, administrative building, girls' room, staff room, spacious air-conditioned assembly hall, indoor games room, playground. There is a Digital Education & Learning Laboratory (DELL) where a Cambridge University collaborative SCOPE is going on. There are 108 CCTV and IP cameras for security and surveillance.

Laboratory Facilities: The science departments (Botany, Chemistry, Forensic Science, Mathematics, Physics, Zoology) and English have well equipped laboratories with computers and internet facilities. Digital sophisticated instruments like tensile tester, colorimeter, potentiometer, pH meter, FT-IR, Gas Chromatographer, UV spectrophotometer are used in common pool.

Green Energy Infrastructure Setup: The college has two solar panel set-up to generate 38 KVA of electricity.

Drinking water facility: The college has 6 RO systems with 120 liter/hour capacity with cool water fountains.

Garden for botanical specimen collection: The garden has 54 perennial species, around 100 annuals maintained properly. Here, an effort is made to conserve some rare and endangered species.

Waste Management: Dry-biomass collected in three pits for composting. The wet waste management is done through effluent treatment.

The college also has another ground shared with Bahauddin Arts College in the same campus which is used for cricket, volleyball, handball, softball, kabaddi, kho-kho, athletics, etc. In indoor, students can practice and play chess, table tennis, boxing, weight and power lifting, judo, karate and wrestling. College has two badminton courts in main building. The college hosts intercollege Chess Tournament frequently.

The college provides essential tools and kits as required. Many students have excelled at various University and state-level tournaments. Our college has successfully organized several university level tournaments. The college hosts one of the oldest cricket tournaments viz. Bhatt Cup Cricket Tournament since 1917 in the tribute to Prof. H. M. Bhatt.

Yoga facility:The college has an open space and corridors for yoga classes conducted by yoga instructor. World Yoga Day every year is celebrated, too.

Facilities for Cultural Activities:For cultural events and competitions, the college has two facilities i.e., an indoor theater (450 persons) and an outdoor open-air theater (550 persons) with state-of-the-art light and sound facilities.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

For laboratory:In all the laboratories GLP (Good Laboratory Practice), dead stock register, issue register and others are regularly maintained. It is noteworthy to mention that our forensic department has an MoU with the forensic science laboratory of the state government. In computer laboratory, all the computer hardware and peripherals are maintained and updated by regular software updates, hardware services and upgrades. For prevention of fire, each laboratory is equipped with adequate fire extinguishers.

For library:Periodically we clean, alter and reshuffle those books and also use herbal germicides for prevention from the book-worms. From time-to-time books are separately classified and torn books are rebind and preserved. Besides this, regular updation insense of increasing and adding to book collection, periodicals and updation of the software is done. For enrichment of the library periodically we get grants from the different funding agencies like government of Gujarat through KCG, RUSA and UGC.

For sports facilities:Timely maintenance of the ground, tools and kits are carried out. Sport department maintains the dead-stock register and a routine register for keeping record. The college gets grant to maintain sports facilities under Saptdhara and RUSA-9.

Administrative level

At administrative level he plays the pivotal role and decentralizes the work to the administrative staff in broadly three domains namely student branch, establishment branch and finance branch. To ensure the exact execution of these branches normally with administrative staff teachers are also allocated duties.

Principal execute through top down model whereby he allocates administrative works to the various department through head of the departments and it percolates systematically.

Senior faculties with academic and administrative expertise are involved in planning and decision-making process in participatory methods.

Academic level

For academic excellence, Principal through HoDs puts the best efforts to provide perfect teaching through proper distribution of the syllabi and by taking feedback to effective implementation of the same. The emphasis is given in development of nurturing skill and understanding of the students. As a science college experimental works and field visits along with theoretical works go hand-in-hand. Various academic committees of different subjects work accordingly to perform in a best way.

Dustbins are purchased under RUSA grants and kept across the buildings. There are three pits specially designed for creating organic compost out of litter of plants from the entire campus. Laboratory waste like broken glassware and biological waste is disposed properly. The solid waste generated in the college campus is managed with the help of Junagadh Municipal Corporation, by pick up service. JMC organized a competition for Clean Campus Drive and in which we received a special appreciation letter from JMC.

Liquid waste management: Proper disposal of liquid waste is done through effluent treatment plant and after regular testing, it is used for the garden.

E-waste management: Normally most of the electronic equipments and gazettes are kept in running condition so minimum waste is produced. E-waste corner has been set up in administrative building to collect and differentiate E-waste.

Waste recycling: We collect all the leaves and debris and keep them in different pits for compost. Cow dungs, Jivamrut are also mixed to make it more fertilized.

Bahauddin Science College, Junagadh was established in 1901, to have the privilege to be affiliated with four universities: Bombay University, Gujarat University, Saurashtra University and at present Bhakta Kavi Narsinh Mehta University. This is because of careful and effective implementation of the curriculum through the well-planned and effective process. The synchronization of effective curriculum delivery process with prevailing academic environment of heritage institute has been developed and deployed to obtain optimum results.

The IQAC of the college with all Heads of Departments (HoDs) and staff members develops strategies for effective implementation of the curriculum. HoDs allocates the theory and laboratory courses to faculties according to area of expertise, skills and relevant experience. Teachers are encouraged to impart the curriculum through presentations, assignments, discussions, workshops, seminars and industrial visits, field visits, study tour including the regular/traditional chalk and talk methods. The advanced and slow learners are identified during classroom and practical teaching and are encouraged to be in touch with concerned teachers to enhance their learning. Here, we would like to emphasize that as there is ample chance to interact one to one with the students especially in practical, the learning levels of the students can be evaluated and queries and doubts can be quenched very easily.

Distinction of the students over their performance is easily sought and hence categorization as advanced and slow learners is done. Advanced and slow learners are identified through their performance levels in regular classroom test, presentation, viva and interaction in class room and laboratory.

Special classes for slow learners are conducted to teach them in feasible manner with all necessary tools, such as models, pictures, animated videos etc. Upon series of interactions, required suggestions are given at the first stage with all necessary instructions to increase his/her strength to become good learner of both theoretical as well as practical aspects. As per the provision in CBCS guidelines, a slow learner is offered periodic tests to increase confidence level to learn subject and to perform well.

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

We follow all the student centric methods like participatory learning through group discussion, seminars, quizzes, puzzles, demonstrations, assignments and field visits to involve the students actively into their own learning process. Active participation in terms of sample collection, chemical preparation, circuit preparation for different devices, models and chart preparations provide an opportunity to nurture students interest in the subject.

Field expeditions are conducted in Botany and Zoology departments. The Girnar Sanctuary and Gir National Park, the last abode of Asiatic Lion, and the Sakkar-Baug Zoological Park in vicinity provides a good exposure to rich flora and fauna of the forest is the privilege to the students to develop their taxonomic and wildlife research skills by visiting the Protected Areas.

Gujarat, being one of the most developed industrial states of country; Chemistry department make visits to industries like pharmaceuticals, dyes, fertilizers to give students hands-on training and thus, enhances their career opportunities.

Physics department visits every year Indian Plasma Research (IPR), Physical Research Laboratory (PRL), Space Application Centre (SAC) ISRO, Ahmedabad.

The college has signed MoU with Regional Forensic Science Laboratory (RFSL) branch of DFS. Every year, students are benefited with the well-equipped sophisticated instrumentation under the guidance of forensic scientists.

Five connection with BHARAT fiber optics, NAMO Wi-Fi scheme provided internet facility on the campus. The whole campus has been equipped with Wi-Fi using the 24 routers.

Multimedia presentations are used as part of regular classroom teaching. We have privilege to have LCD projectors in almost all the classrooms and there are smart classrooms as well for better multimedia exposure. Teacher can use the videos captured with SONY handy-cam and display in classroom. Bhaskaracharya Institute for Space Applications and Geo-Informatics (BISAG), an initiative of the Government of Gujarat where state wide classroom known as SANDHAN with the help of satellite disc tv. SANDHAN is a part of college time table. In recent times, colleges also benefited by MS team, initiative of Government of Gujarat to carry out all the academic programs like teaching, examination, assignment submission during the pandemic period. College also use social media platforms like whatsapp, etc. to sort-out the queries and problems of the students.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The evaluation mechanism followed by the College is in conformity with the affiliating university, i.e. Bhakta Kavi Narsinh Mehta University, Junagadh (BKNMU). University has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in across all of its curricula. Continuous Internal Evaluation system is an integral part of the evaluation mechanism in CBCS. The college has an internal examination committee which looks after the conduction of internal examination as scheduled by university and prepare results. The time table for internal examinations is prepared, displayed on the central notice board and also sent to respective departments.

Teachers assess a student in a course through their interaction throughout the semester for their internal evaluation including one or more of the following mechanisms such as written tests, class presentations/seminars, viva, assignments, quizzes, etc. with their maximum weightage of 30 marks. Internal examination is conducted under CCTV surveillance with utmost confidentiality. We have 5 marks for regular attendance in internal evaluation. The marks of internal evaluation are put on the notice board and then entry of the same is made online onto the university portal. The remaining 70% of the marks are awarded through the External Semester Examination conducted by the university.

The grievances of the students related to examinations are addressed at two levels—College and University—depending upon the nature of the grievances. Grievances related to the internal assessment are handled by the internal examination committee of the College whereas grievances related to the external assessment are forwarded to the University. Here, we would like to mention that we are fortunate so far we have not received any complaint regarding internal assessment due to transparent mechanism.

All the examinations are conducted under active CCTV surveillance with recording facility. Students are free to approach teachers and heads of departments to resolve their queries related to the marks obtained in internal assessment. If the student concerned is not satisfied by the procedure mentioned above, they may approach to the internal examination committee of the college or the Principal. Thus, grievance redressal with reference to examinations is transparent. Examination related grievances are received by the authorities concerned of the college in a time-bound manner. All complaints are attended with utmost alacrity and resolved. The grievance redressal mechanism pertaining to examinations is efficient as all complaints to be entertained without exception and to be resolved within a reasonable amount of time.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES**4.1 - Physical Facilities**

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

This college spreads over 6070 m2 of campus with built-up area of 4509 m2. The college has 15 classrooms (7 smart-class) equipped with audio-visual aids, 15 laboratories, library, administrative building, girls' room, staff room, spacious air-conditioned assembly hall, indoor games room, playground. There is a Digital Education & Learning Laboratory (DELL) where a Cambridge University collaborative SCOPE is going on. There are 108 CCTV and IP cameras for security and surveillance.

Laboratory Facilities: The science departments (Botany, Chemistry, Forensic Science, Mathematics, Physics, Zoology) and English have well equipped laboratories with computers and internet facilities. Digital sophisticated instruments like tensile tester, colorimeter, potentiometer, pH meter, FT-IR, Gas Chromatographer, UV spectrophotometer are used in common pool.

Green Energy Infrastructure Setup: The college has two solar panel set-up to generate 38 KVA of electricity.

Drinking water facility: The college has 6 RO systems with 120 liter/hour capacity with cool water fountains.

Garden for botanical specimen collection:The garden has 54 perennial species, around 100 annuals maintained properly. Here, an effort is made to conserve some rare and endangered species.

Waste Management:Dry-biomass collected in three pits for composting. The wet waste management is done through effluent treatment.

Bhatt Cup Cricket Tournament since 1917 in the tribute to Prof. H. M. Bhatt.

Yoga facility:The college has an open space and corridors for yoga classes conducted by yoga instructor. World Yoga Day every year is celebrated, too.

Facilities for Cultural Activities:For cultural events and competitions, the college has two facilities i.e., an indoor theater (450 persons) and an outdoor open-air theater (550 persons) with state-of-the-art light and sound facilities.

For laboratory:In all the laboratories GLP (Good Laboratory Practice), dead stock register, issue register and others are regularly maintained. It is noteworthy to mention that our forensic department has an MoU with the forensic science laboratory of the state government. In computer laboratory, all the computer hardware and peripherals are maintained and updated by regular software updates, hardware services and upgrades. For prevention of fire, each laboratory is equipped with adequate fire extinguishers.

For library:Periodically we clean, alter and reshuffle those books and also use herbal germicides for prevention from the book-worms. From time-to-time books are separately classified and torn books are rebind and preserved. Besides this, regular updation insense of increasing and adding to book collection, periodicals and updation of the software is done. For enrichment of the library periodically we get grants from the different funding agencies like government of Gujarat through KCG, RUSA and UGC.

For sports facilities:Timely maintenance of the ground, tools and kits are carried out. Sport department maintains the dead-stock register and a routine register for keeping record. The college gets grant to maintain sports facilities under Saptdhara and RUSA-9.

As this is government college funding is solely dependent on state government and central government funding agencies. Entire grants of salary and development is directly given to the college and principal as virtue of post becomes the DDO (Drawing and Disbursing Officer). The utilization of grants is the subject to audit from the education department, local audit department (State Government) and Accountant General Office (Central Government).

The external auditors verify and certify the entire income and expenditure and the Capital Expenditure of the Institute each year. The internal auditors from the higher office check and verify all the vouchers of the transactions that are carried out in each financial year. Likewise, an external audit is also carried out time to time by Accountant General, Government of India. We would like to categorically mentioned that up to now there have been no major objections found by any audit agencies.

Minor errors of omissions and commissions when pointed out by the audit team are immediately corrected and precautionary steps are taken to avoid recurrence of such errors in future. The audits of grant under initiatives of Government of Gujarat like UDISHA, Saptdhara, Finishing School etc. are done by local authorized Chartered Accountant.

Solid waste management: Entire college campus is cleaned regularly by sweepers and occasionally by students. The solid waste of dusting, debris of ground, and dried leaves are kept separately. Dustbins are purchased under RUSA grants and kept across the buildings. There are three pits specially designed for creating organic compost out of litter of plants from the entire campus. Laboratory waste like broken glassware and biological waste is disposed properly. The solid waste generated in the college campus is managed with the help of Junagadh Municipal Corporation, by pick up service. JMC organized a competition for Clean Campus Drive and in which we received a special appreciation letter from JMC.

Liquid waste management: Proper disposal of liquid waste is done through effluent treatment plant and after regular testing, it is used for the garden.

E-waste management: Normally most of the electronic equipments and gazettes are kept in running condition so minimum waste is produced. E-waste corner has been set up in administrative building to collect and differentiate E-waste.

Waste recycling: We collect all the leaves and debris and keep them in different pits for compost. Cow dungs, Jivamrut are also mixed to make it more fertilized.
